Call to Order/Opening Remarks
 Denise called to order the regular meeting of the Troop 652 Parent Committee at 6:35 PM.

II. Scoutmaster Open Discussion (Shawna and Kevin)

- The boys are planning to go to Observatory Park in April. Camping options nearby are still closed for the season so a camping spot needs to be found. Craig is looking into it. The boys are also in discussion to do the Aviation merit badge at MAPPS in May. There is also discussion about a parent campout. TBD.
- The girls are planning for a campout in April to do the Horsemanship merit badge. May campout TBD.
- Crossovers will be held this month. Pack 652 on March 8, Pack 297 on March 9, and Pack 28 on March 21. Approximately eleven boys and three girls will join the troop.
- Discussion: Health and safety of a scout on the Polar Bear Campout. He did not have the proper gear or clothing for the weekend.
- The polar bear campout was great. We had cold weather; it was a perfect day on Saturday. The scouts went sled riding and did well adhering to the rules of staying outdoors for 24 hours to earn the award. Six boys and two girls attended.
- Seventeen boys and five girls are signed up to attend the March campout. Robb, Kevin, and Denise are the troop leaders attending.
- There is a summer camp intro meeting tonight to discuss the registration process. Craig will handle the admin for the boys' troop, and Irene will do admin for the girls. Robb will handle all the onsite paperwork and documents for the week at camp.
- Troop scholarships will be announced tonight. Application process TBA.
- The girls are working on the Public Speaking merit badge. They will begin the Reading merit badge. A library visit is scheduled for March 19. Boys are welcome to also do the badge.
- There is no space to meet at the church during Holy Week (April 16). Robb will check into doing swim tests at the Brecksville pool as an alternative meeting place.
- Broadview Heights' councilman Brian Wolf will be at tonight's meeting for rank requirement 9A.

- The treasurer role transition from Gail to Sal is complete. Sal will have a proposed budget for the girls' troop in April.

Fundraising (Janet, Robby)

- The girls' troop Spaghetti Dinner Fundraiser is March 15. Robby Maher is coordinating the fundraiser. A flyer
 and promotional items have been created. An announcement was in this past weekend's church bulletin.
 Donations are requested for raffle baskets. The girls' troop will need many helpers to make this event
 happen. Boy troop members are encouraged to help and can earn service hours for being at the event.
- Discussion: Increasing the sale price of pop and water to increase our revenue at Brecksville Home Days. Currently, the price is \$1 per item.

Equipment Coordinator (Jim – no report)

- The back door seals on the boys' trailer may have been damaged during the last campout weekend. There was some issue with opening the doors since may have been frozen shut. Shelving needs to be completed in the nose of the boys' trailer.
- Charcoal was purchased for the February campout.

Service Projects

- The troops will participate in Lake Erie Council's Trash the Trash Day on May 3. Council partners with CanalWay Partners for Riversweep to help clean up parks and public spaces. Scouts will earn conservation hours. Mrs. Christian is coordinating.
- Camp Manatoc will have a tree planting and spring clean-up event. Scouts can earn conservation hours.
- The St. Basil Parish Picnic is scheduled for June 8. Troop members will help at the event. A shift sign-up will be shared.
- 4-6 volunteers are needed on June 5 to help from 6:30-7:30 PM at the parish food truck event. Scouts will be collecting trash and keeping areas clean. Speak with Mrs. Weisfelder if you can help.
- Discussion: Local organization Trails for Hope provides food bags for the unhoused and shut ins. How can the troop get involved.
- Discussion: Recruiting an adult volunteer that can find and coordinate service projects for the troop.
- Scouts should be noting their completed service hours in the appropriate place in their handbooks.

- 652B Campership Program: The boys' troop will institute a scholarship program for troop scouts. Annually, there will be two camperships available for scouts to apply for. One campership will be awarded by the program leaders and one campership will be awarded by the committee. Camperships are intended to award outstanding scouts for their participation in Scouting and to help defray the cost of attending summer camps or high adventure activities. Applications will be created and made available to all troop members. The committee will recruit outside reviewers to read applications and recommend awards. Potential to announce campership awardees at a spring troop Court of Honor before summer camp season. Details will be announced to the troop as they are available.
- 652G Campership Program (The Ella Fund): 652G will adopt an application process for girls' troop members interested in attending high adventure camps.


