A small, independent committee will review the scholarship applications in Classroom 10 this evening. Applications will be read, and the winners (one boy, one girl) will be chosen through a blind selection process. Winners will be announced at the troop court of honor on May 7.

- I. Call to Order/Opening Remarks

 Denise called to order the regular meeting of the Troop 652 Parent Committee at 6:35 PM.
- II. Scoutmaster Open Discussion (Shawna, Kevin, and Robb)
 - The girls' and boys' troops will have a joint campout in May at Geauga Park District's Observatory Park.
 - The girls will work on the Horsemanship merit badge on August 23 at Angel Haven Horse Rescue. TBD if it will be a day event or a camping opportunity. Shawna will confirm the number that can attend and possibly open the merit badge activity to the boys.
 - First Aid, Scouting Heritage, and Cooking merit badges will be started tonight for any scout that needs it or would like to begin working on it.
 - To earn conservation service hours, the girls are participating in Trash the Trash Day on May 3. Boys are invited to join and should register ASAP. See the emails from Mrs. Christian.
 - The April campout at Richfield Heritage Park was a good event with nice weather. Seventeen scouts and six leaders attended. We also had a good number of families show up to visit for the day. Scouts should log campouts, and nights in tents, in their handbooks.
 - Swim tests were administered at Brecksville's indoor pool on April 16. About 90% of our troop members attended. The city pool said we could come back any time.
 - For Manatoc Summer Camp, our campsite (Dan Beard) is over capacity for the number of platform tents available. We'll need to have an internal discussion to map out the campsite and determine who will buddy in platform tents and who will bring their own tent. Currently, 30 boys, 6 girls, and 6 adults are registered to attend Manatoc.
 - Discussion: Considering a bigger campsite in future years and what is available at Manatoc. Placing a deposit
 for next year's summer camp and potential site selection. Does the option of a second week of summer
 camp somewhere other than Manatoc lower the potential number of attendees? No, because many scouts
 choose to attend both weeks/options.
 - Robb will complete the training for the Roman Catholic religious emblem (Ad Altare Dei). He plans to offer the class to scouts beginning in June or July, possibly before or after Wednesday evening troop meetings.
 - Discussion: Changes to opening ceremony for troop meetings. Discussed in PLC but not shared with scoutmaster. A request to make sure everyone is well-informed of any ceremonial changes.
 - Discussion: Rank advancement BOR process and a scout's recent experience during a BOR with troop committee members. Review of questions and conversation during a BOR and how it should be handled. The goal of the BOR should be to encourage the scout as well as review their accomplishments.

Outdoor/Activities Chair, Boys (Craig)

• The collection of paperwork for the April campout went smoothly. Camper fees and forms for the May campout should be turned in by May 7.

- The Observatory Park campout is May 9-11 in Montville (Geauga County). There will be a special program for our campers at the Planetarium at 6:00 PM followed by a dark sky program open to the public at 8:00 PM. There may be a \$5 entry fee charged by the Geauga Park District. TBA.

- The troops received an email invitation to 'Meet the Troops Night' at Ridgewood United Methodist Church in Parma on Wednesday, May 14. Scouting units in the Parma area have been invited to an open house-type event for fourth grade Webelos that will cross over next year. It's an opportunity to be visible, show and tell our units, and meet potential scouts. The email invitation was forwarded to our committee chair and scoutmasters. But, it's uncertain if we can attend since its regular troop meeting night and our number of weeks to prepare for summer camp are limited.
